Hunter Ice Skating Club Coaches Code of Behaviour



In the interest of safety and harmony of skating, coaches and skaters of all levels should observe the following Code of Behaviour.

- i. Place the safety and welfare of the athletes above all else,
- ii. Help each skater reach their potential respect the talent, development stage and goals of each skater and encourage with positive and supportive feedback,
- iii. Any physical contact with a person should be appropriate to the situation and necessary for the person's skill development,
- iv. Be honest and do not allow your qualifications to be misrepresented,
- v. Focus on your students' efforts and performance rather than whether they win or lose,
- vi. Be reasonable in your demands on skater's time, energy, and enthusiasm,
- vii. Operate within the rules and spirit of the sport and teach the skaters to do the same,
- viii. All skaters are deserving of equal time and attention according to the needs and goals of the skater.
- ix. Ensure that the time the skater spends with you is a positive experience,
- x. Ensure that equipment and facilities meet safety standards and are appropriate to the age and ability of all athletes,
- xi. Display control, respect, and professionalism to all involved with the sport. This includes athletes, coaches, officials, administrators, the media, parents, and spectators. Encourage athletes to do the same,
- xii. Show concern and caution toward sick and injured athletes. Follow the advice of a physician when determining whether an injured athlete is ready to recommence training or competition,
- xiii. If a skater wishes to change coaches, both coaches should be respectful of the skater's decision,
- xiv. Obtain appropriate qualifications according to APSA and keep up to date with the latest coaching practices and the principles of growth and development of skaters,
- xv. Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background, or religion.
